The summer months are upon us, but our work is never done. Our Congress is continuing to work to repeal the Legacy and Reconciliation Act of 2023 that was put in effect on May 1, 2024. They have sent a letter, signed

by 24 of our congressmen to the newly elected Prime Minister, Rt. Hon. Keir Stamer, MP. They have congratulated him on his election and that he is “committed to repeal and replace the Northern Ireland Troubles (Legacy and Reconciliation) Act of 2023. The Labour Party’s manifesto states, **“The Legacy Act denies justice for the families and victims of the Troubles. Labour will repeal and replace it, by returning to the principles of the Stormont House Agreement, and seeking support from all communities in Northern Ireland.”** Please be sure to encourage you Congressman to support these efforts of this by-partisan group of congressmen who support justice for all in Northern Ireland. I will continue to update you as more information is made available.
