To kick off our fundraising this term, we will be ordering shirts. We have picked 2 different shirts available for you purchase. The first is a light weight long sleeve 1/4 zip performance polo. #### Division 18 Peekskill


Member Kathleen Hegarty celebrated her 100<sup>th</sup> birthday with family and friends on July 14, 2021.






### **Suffolk County Division 7**
