NYS Treasurer: JoAnn Gunderson

Hello Sisters, it is the time of year all Counties and Divisions are submitting their 2022 Financial Reports. As the LAOH NYS Treasurer, I often get asked the question, "What is the \$.50 'Appeals for Aid' used for, that every member must pay annually, with their Per Capita Taxes.

At the LAOH National Convention (2018) in Louisville, KY, the National Appeals for Aid Committee met, and a motion was made and approved to assess each LAOH Division throughout the United States (including NY) \$.50 per member, based on their year-end membership reports. The purpose of this assessment is to fund the National Appeals for Aid. This assessment started in 2019. (Religious, National Life Members and Consecrated Virgins are exempt from this assessment).

Prior to every LAOH National Convention, the National Missions and Charities Officer will post on the National Website information regarding the Appeals for Aid Grant, where a 501 © 3 charity can apply, which may result in the charity receiving grant money. The Appeals for Aid Committee meets at each National Convention and the chairperson presents to the committee, for discussion, all the grant applications received. The committee will approve the application(s) that qualify for the grant and will also vote on how much money each charity will receive.

In addition to the \$.50, paid each year, Individual Members, Counties, and Divisions are encouraged to donate to the National Appeals for Aid Fund by using the Missions and Charities Donation Form found on the LAOH National website www.ladiesaoh.com under Missions and Charities Officer. This extra money, along with the \$.50 per member is added together and the total amount collected is presented at the National Convention, Appeals for Aid Committee meeting. This money is then disbursed to all approved Appeals for Aid applicants.

Information and application for the Patricia Doyle Memorial Grant has been sent out to all County/Division Presidents to share with you. They are also available on our Web site along with the donation form for the fund. The deadline for the applications is April 13, 2023.

Due to the shortening of our State Convention, there will be no hands on "St. Brigid's Day of Caring". Instead, we will be collecting items for the Open Door Mission of Rochester. This mission was established in 1952. First providing clothing and food, then growing to include an addiction recovery program and a men's shelter. This is where we come in. We will be collecting Hygiene items. Toothpaste, toothbrushes, deodorant, bar soap and body wash. Smaller, travel sizes are preferred.
