# Freedom for All Ireland Joan Moore

Welcome back to all that traveled to Ireland on the FFAI trip. All reports indicate that it was a huge success, and every effort was made by the organizers to share as much of it with those of us who could not go. You can find pictures and comments on both the AOH and LAOH Facebook pages as well as on YouTube. There is a presentation of the checks to the different recipients of our 2021-2022 Christmas appeal. After meeting with several high-level politicians, the main "take-away" is the importance of the Irish, Irish-American communities and all those who believe in Justice to oppose the Legacy Legislation that Boris Johnson is pushing thru the Parliament. On May 24<sup>th</sup> there was the second reading in Parliament that passed this Legislation. A group from Northern Ireland, coordinated by Relatives for Justice, had travelled to England to express their opposition and to deliver a letter to 10 Downing Street in a peaceful protest to this unfair Bill. On June 6<sup>th</sup> there was a "Confidence Vote" for Boris Johnston, in which he "squeaked by" with. It is important that we all be aware of what is happening in the Parliament because of the long reaching effects on the North of Ireland and the families that have been trying to get justice for their loved ones for so many years. Dolores Desch, our National FFAI Chair, continuously post information, articles, videos and webinars of the website and Facebook pages LAOH Freedom For All Ireland | Facebook (. Please read these communications and make your Representative aware of the happenings so that they can support the Bills or Legislations that may come up regarding this. The Irish Government, the political parties and the people of Northern Ireland, have all stressed how important it is to have the USA government and the Irish communities, behind them to stop this blanketed Amnesty the British government is trying to push through. Several hearings have already proven collusion, and the British are afraid of what might come out if further investigations continue. These families deserve justice for their innocent family members. The British must live up to their commitment of the Stormont House Agreement and the Good Friday Agreement that has creative a "peace" in the North for last 20 years. There will be a FFAI Committee meeting for the National Convention of Monday, June 27 at 7:30 for those of you that have signed up to go to this meeting and the Convention in Pittsburgh. 
